

## Trust Board Update Report on the Dementia CQUIN 2014/2015

### Dementia and Delirium – Find, Assess, Investigate and Refer (FAIR)

The Dementia CQUIN has been developed to ensure that every patient who is admitted to hospital with delirium or a suspicion of dementia, where appropriate, is identified, assessed, investigated and referred. To date, SaTH has shown a marked improvement in the performance of this element.

Please see the figures below for Q2, Q3 and Q4. The requirement is for 90% compliance.
