Executive summary

This report highlights action taken in relation to security management in 2011-12 including:

- Security policies revised and pass NHSLA assessment.
- Pilot program of preventative security risk assessment completed with positive results.
- Acts of physical and verbal abuse down 27.5% since 1st April 2009.
- SaTH in the best 10% of Trusts for bringing criminal sanction for intentional physical assault.
- Numbers of staff trained in Conflict Resolution shows year on increases.
- Body Worn Video equipment issued to security teams at both hospital sites.
- Baby tagging system at the RSH Maternity building receives significant upgrade.
- Support for and expansion of Lone Worker programs continues.
- Clinical aggression reports increase.
- Funding for extra security staff declined.
- Capital funding for improvements to security infrastructure (access control and CCTV) declined.
