DAYTIME : Turn ON by closing the battery door	ON	Check the hearing aid is working by switching it on, cupping your hands around the mould and aid. Listen for a whistle/buzz. Help to put the ear mould in			
PROMOTE WEARING HEARING AIDS DAILY AS A ROUTINE TO ENSURE THE BRAIN IS STIMULATED BY EVERYDAY SOUNDS	Hearing ald	correctly – you can gently pull the ear lobe down. Wearing the hearing aid/s should be part of a daily living routine eg after washing in the morning.			
EVERY NIGHT					
NIGHT: Turn OFF by opening the battery door	OFF	Keep the hearing aid box in the same place at night in a visible place eg bedside table. It could have left/right hearing aid written on the box. Red dot for Right ear.			
CLEAN THE EAR MOULD EVERY NIGHT	K	Clean the ear mould with a baby wipe or clean damp cloth to stop it getting blocked with wax or dry skin and keep it working well.			
EVERY WEEK					
CHANGE BATTERIES WEEKLY eg every Sunday (They can last 7 – 10 days and beep when running out)		Remove the label from the new battery and put the battery in + side up. Check each month how many batteries are left to make sure they don't run out and ring/email audiology for more or get more from your GP surgery.			
EVERY 6 MONTHS					
REPLACE THE TUBING		Put reminders on the calendar every 6 months. Contact Audiology to get the tubing changed/learn to retube.
