| <b>Brief Description</b>   | <p>The Trust Board will hear two stories which demonstrate proactive work to avoid unnecessary admissions and also occasions when opportunities are missed to improve patient experience by expediting care management and enabling a patient to get back to their place of residence in a timely way.</p> <p>Facts about deconditioning in include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 10 days bed rest leads to equivalent of 10 years of muscle ageing in people over 80</li> <li>• 60% of immobile patients had no medical reason requiring bedrest</li> <li>• 48% of people over 85 die within one year of hospital admission</li> <li>• 47% of delayed transfers of care in one study related to deconditioning</li> </ul> |
