Paper Title	How the Trust can improve on its communication with patients with learning difficulties
Brief Description	This patient story relates to a patient who has to access health care on a regular basis and how she felt her experience could have been improved during her stay at SaTH.
	The experience is portrayed by the patient and her carer (her mother). The following important points are drawn out:
	<ul> <li>Barrier to communication - not speaking directly to her but talking to third person. This caused the patient distress and lack of autonomy.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>What was important to her e.g. bringing and having her comforter (toy) and the use of personal contact e.g. touch to comfort and reassure her - holding her hand.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>To keep patient and her carers informed at all times of her care and the need to involve them.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>To convey the above information during handover to other providers of care e.g. other hospital / professionals.</li> </ul>
	The main learning is the importance of verbal and non-verbal communication and how it is important to tailor this to meet the individual needs of the patient.
