## **Hearing Aid Listening Checks**

- Attach the listening stick to the hearing aid and if possible turn the volume down.
- Switch the hearing aid on.
- Turn the volume up to a comfortable listening level.
- Talk at a normal level whilst gently squeezing the aid. Move the volume control and switches up and down in order to check they are functioning correctly. Any crackling, hissing or going on and off indicates a major fault.
- If a major fault occurs take the hearing aid off the child and contact the Teacher of the Deaf (ToD).
