Executive Summary

This paper describes how the Transforming Care Production System (TCPS) continues to support the implementation of the organisational strategy, improving the experience of patients, their families and our staff.

This month's update, as requested by Trust Board is to provide assurance on:

Kaizen Promotion Office (KPO) Activity

Over the last month the KPO Team have been supporting over 15 genba walks with Trust Executives. The genba walk helps to support colleagues with their improvement work. It is also an opportunity to celebrate staff and their achievements.

TCPS work continues, for example, in August 2019 the KPO Team supported three process mapping exercises, a kaizen event, a Rapid Process Improvement Week (RPIW) and delivery of x3 Lean for Leaders training sessions.

Trust Value Streams Update and progress

The Trust Guiding Team have made the decision to transition some of the value streams so the focus and support can be increased for the remaining four value streams:

- Value Stream #2 Sepsis
- Value Stream #5 Patient Safety

The table above details the additional activity the KPO Team has supported during August and September 2019, in addition to the KPO Team standard work.

Training of Lean for Leaders continues and we now have a rolling plan for further cohorts into 2020.

The KPO Team continue to support the Trust's Quality Improvement Plans (QIP), and as the organisation continues to improve there is a 'pull' for the KPO Team to provide bespoke training on topics within the TCPS methodology to support the actions within the QIP.

The process mapping exercises and kaizen events will address some of the actions from the ISG plans.

The KPO Team have also supported a mental health huddle on Friday 30 August 2019 and a visit by Hugh McCaughey, National Director of NHS Improvement, at the Princess Royal Hospital, Telford on Friday 13 September 2019.

Trust Value Streams Update and Progress

The SaTH Guiding Team is keen to align the organisational priorities and goals to the current value streams. The current 7 value streams were reviewed at the August 2019 TCPS Guiding Team meeting, and there is a plan to transition VS#3 Non-Medical Recruitment, VS#4 OPD Ophthalmology and VS#7 Radiology value streams back to the appropriate support groups. The four continuing value streams for the next 12 months are VS#2 Sepsis, VS#5 Patient Safety, VS#6 Emergency Department and VS#8 Surgical Pathway.

A revised agenda will be trialled at the next Transforming Care Partnership Board Meeting (previously known as the SaTH Guiding Team Meeting) which will incorporate all quality improvement initiatives across SaTH.

Background

Sepsis Kaizen Event

Sepsis is a devastating, deadly condition. Sepsis now claims more lives than lung cancer – the second biggest killer after cardiovascular disease. Once sepsis is identified, time is of the essence. The Sepsis Six Bundle as a whole has been shown to reduce the relative risk of death by 46.6% when delivered to patients with severe sepsis within one hour.

Evidence has shown that for each hours delay in administering antibiotics in septic shock, mortality increases by 2% to 5%. It is paramount that that healthcare professionals in the Emergency Department work as a team to be vigilant in recognition of sepsis, to deliver timely treatment and completion of documentation as these will save lives and improve our patient outcomes.

The purpose of the kaizen event was to improve the recognition, treatment and documentation for patients presenting with Sepsis to ED. The boundaries are, **From**: When a patient with suspected sepsis arrives in ED, **To**: When the patient has received the complete Sepsis Bundle and the treatment is documented. The improvements will be tested and monitored through remeasures at 30, 60 and 90 days.

Surgical Pathway Value Stream RPIW #4

The scope of the RPIW was to explore the pre-operative assessment for patients on the 2-week cancer pathway. Currently the 2-week cancer pathway has a number of patients requiring elective surgery with short timelines, for example, vascular. These patients are not being referred to pre-op assessment as early as they could be. It is important to improve this to facilitate pre optimisation of patients prior to surgery. This is often not possible due to the late referral of patients.

Mental Health Huddle

On Friday 30 August 2019, the KPO Team supported an extended staff kaizen huddle to facilitate a discussion around mental health.

The session was well attended at RSH and PRH, with staff, patient representatives and support organisations able to explore what mental health means to them, what are the barriers to caring for patients with mental health problems and what training and support is available for staff and families.

Assessment

Trust Value Streams Update and progress

The Trust's Value Stream Sponsor Teams continue to meet monthly and develop the kaizen plan for future improvement work. The Sponsor Teams incorporate the related ISG actions to ensure TCPS is being used to address the CQC concerns.

There are two Kaizen Events and one RPIW planned for October 2019. The KPO Team will be presenting the value stream work at the upcoming SaTH Leadership conference on 11 October 2019.

Patient Experience Strategy

The KPO Team have been supporting the Patient Experience Lead, Ruth Smith to develop the SaTH Patient Experience Strategy. This has involved attending and co-facilitating focus groups to explore what strategy means to patients and what is important to them when they come into our hospital. The next steps are to support two Development Days in October 2019.

External Visit

Hugh McCaughey, National Director of NHS Improvement visited the Trust on Friday 13 September

2019. The KPO Team hosted the visit at PRH, and the day consisted of 4 genba walks, and a meet and greet session with staff and patient representatives who have been involved in TCPS improvement work, and attendance at the weekly Staff Kaizen Huddle.
