Aim

- Negative feedback from Junior Doctors on navigation capabilities of intranet page
- Need to create a more efficient working environment


Homs

 - ▶ In clinical settings
 - ▶ Ward, clinic, Emergency Department
- Collected response data
- Evaluated data and designed web page based on responses


Survey

- ▶ Do you think a Junior Doctors' clinical guidelines link with common guidelines would help you during your day to day work/on-call shifts?


Junior clinicians surveyed (n = 31)




How do you find guidelines?

Time observation study

- ► Foundation year 1 doctor referring to cardiology
 - ▶ Base Ward 32
- Assess waste at workplace

Time taken to complete cardiology referral

- 1)Retrieve form and return to clinical area
- Old system
 - ▶ 6:12 minutes
- New System
 - 0:55 minutes
- 2) Whole task
- Old system
 - ▶ <u>12:33 minutes</u> of no value added time
- New System
 - ▶ <u>7:16 minutes</u> of no value added time

What this means for Junior Doctors at Sath?

- Concerns listened to and acted upon
- Work in a more efficient environment
- Better access to clinical guidelines
- Spend less time on daily clinical tasks (referrals, contact details etc.)
- Opportunity to attend extra clinical work increased e.g. clinic/theatre

Future Plans

- Review of in-patient referral methods
- Expansion to RSH/PRH specific pages
- Liaise with Doctors' Mess for event posting
- Re-survey to assess need of changes
