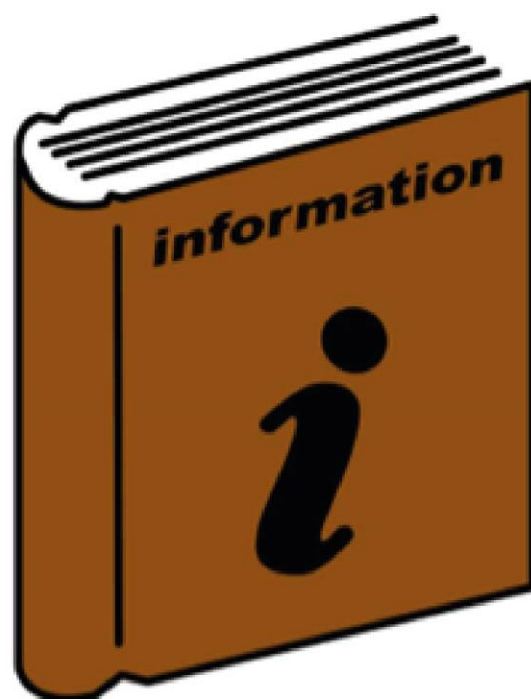
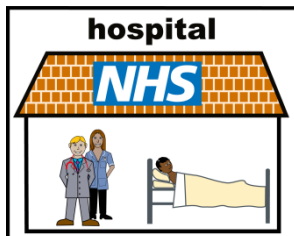


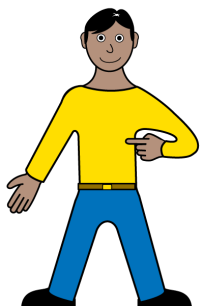
# Acute Liaison Nurses

They work with you and your family or carer when you are in hospital.



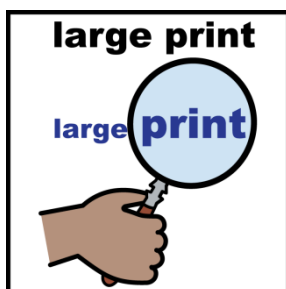
The Acute Liaison Nurses help staff to understand the needs of adults with a learning disability.



They can help to plan your appointments and come to your appointment with you.



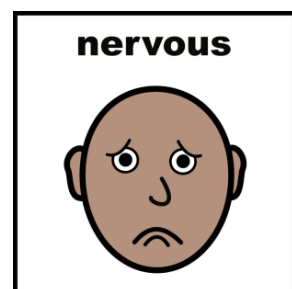
They can give you easy read information to make sure you understand.



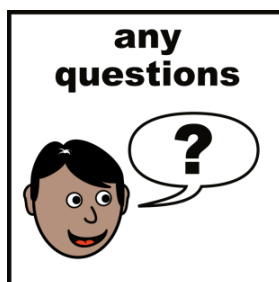
They can help staff to make changes to make it easier for you. For example, using pictures or large print or Makaton.

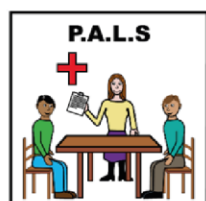

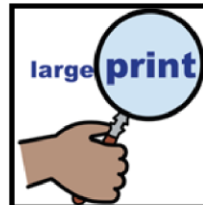
