Pain is when part of your body is sore or hurts.






This leaflet is for people who have had an **operation** in hospital.

Most people feel some pain after their operation.



It may hurt on the part of your body where you had your operation.

Medicine can make your pain go away for a while.



If you are in pain you can be given some medicine.



If you need help or are in pain tell the nurse.


They will help you.



A nurse can give you medicine for your pain. The nurse will check if this has helped.

If the pain comes back the nurse can give you more medicine.

This pain scale may help you say how bad the pain is.




You may not be able to tell us that you are in pain.

Some people show they are in pain by how they behave.








Your supporters can tell us how to notice you are in pain.
