2a Alert	The Committee wish to alert members of the Board that:					
	 The Trust is forecasting non compliance in September and subsequent months with the national activity level threshold for recovery; risk remains with the bed capacity to manage elective as well as urgent care demand, leading to associated risks with waiting times. The Committee acknowledged the excellent work taking place to address the bed gap but recognised that the impact of COVID-19 would result in a very difficult winter ahead, which will be significantly worse than in previous years. Substantial and extended disruption to scheduled care through the winter months is likely and ways of caring safely for patients waiting for emergency admission are being worked through as part of the winter planning. Support from the wider system will be required to help mitigate these risks. Diagnostic performance was considerably below pre-COVID-19 levels and the Trust is one of the worst performing Trusts in England for DMO1. As our excellent Pre-COVID-19 performance was only achieved by operating equipment at maximum capacity the new COVID-19 constraints have imposed hard bottlenecks on performance. Accordingly diagnostic performance will only improve significantly in the spring with access to additional permanent, temporary and mobile equipment and facilities. There are a significant number of changes to the funding regime for the second six months of the year and changes in sources of funding between block, top up and COVID-19 allocation. The detail of these and impact is still being determined. Other 					

2b	Assurance	 factors/risks, which may impact on the financial position are the introduction of elective incentive scheme from Month 6 which will potentially result in £4.3 million deduction, possible non-delivery of Capital Resource Limit and the impact of additional business cases to address, quality, safety, regulatory and operational issues on the forecast outturn for 2020/21 and the exit run rate into 2021/22. The Committee was assured by the Trust's commitment to focus on the clinically urgent and cancer patients in its restoration of services and was working hard to reduce the number of patients waiting over 62 days. While performance is poor against national standards there had been a significant improvement in two week wait cancer performance and comparatively the Trust 		
		has delivered one of the best cancer performance in England. RTT performance (while poor against the national standards) is also above average for all the Trusts in England. Under the circumstances the Executive is to be congratulated for this.		
2c	Advise	 The Committee wish to advise members of the Board that: The Trust has reported a break even position for the month of August. The Committee received and approved expenditure plans for an additional capital allocation of £3.537 million (as part of a revised STP capital allocation in relation to Critical Infrastructure Risk). This is in addition to the Board approved plan of £19.076 million. The Committee recommended approval of this by the Board of Directors. The detailed plan is set out in Appendix 1. The Committee received and approved the annual Reference Cost Submission 2019/20. The Committee considered business cases for Enhanced Middle-Grade Rota and Paediatric Services Safer Staffing. Acknowledging the quality and safety implications of these and subject to post business case implementation reviews taking place in 12 months time, the Committee recommended approval of these by the Board of Directors. The Committee approved the Data Security and Protection Toolkit 2019/20 Submission but noted the risks associated with the delivery of the improvement plan. The Committee received the Health, Safety, Security and Fire Committee Annual Report 2019/20 and Good Corporate Citizen Annual Report 2019/20 and recommended approval of these by the Board of Directors. A summary of Contract Award Recommendations in respect of capital and revenue schemes was received and noted.
