Lisa Beresford will be attending a Board Seminar later this month, to discuss all matters risk, with the Board members. A brief oversight of our current risk framework, with changes seen over the last 4 months, are included on the attached risk table. Introduction

- 1.1 Colleagues are asked to note the summary details from the Trust Risk Register for the period ending 31 January 2022. The full detailed reports were sent out across the Trust and divisions by email on 2 February 2022 and were received by over 100 colleagues. It is those detailed reports that are currently used by those with a responsibility for risk management in their areas to update and review their risks, noting whether new risks should be added, or older risks removed when mitigated.
- 1.2 The format of the report intends to provide an overview of the last four months, highlighting trends in the total numbers of risks reported, opened and closed.

Highlights

2.1 Details across divisions and corporate can be found on the appendix.

Progress with revised Risk Management Framework

- 3.1 The project to transfer of our risk registers from 4Risk to Datix, is well under way. Our new interim Head of Risk, Lisa Beresford, has been working on the new risk module and risk management toolkit, both of which are now complete.
- 3.2 As we review our plans for 2022/23, progress with the current project milestones is being tracked through our Getting to Good framework to provide additional assurance that progress is being made with our new risk management approach.
- 3.3 Risk Management will be featured as part of the Board of Directors Seminar, later this month, and the new framework and documentation will be introduced.
- 3.4 The revised suite of risk management documentation will be reviewed by the Audit and Risk Assurance Committee later this month, with a view to approval at the Board of Directors next month. This will take the place of the current risk management policy.
- 3.5 The refreshed Operational Risk Management Group will be re-established and is due to meet this month for the first time in over 18 months.
- 3.6 The task of transferring the +400 risks from 4Risk to the new datix platform (further to their review) will soon begin some short-term resource will be required to support this task.
